When locals bring guests to the show, they come for the food. A feast for the eyes as well as the palate, this selection of regional dishes from all over Mexico is ample and offers something for everyone. When the doors open, waiters dressed in mariachi regalia and wide sombreros spring into action bringing beer, mixed and soft drinks to guest as the line forms for the scrumptious buffet. In all, 15 selections are offered, including marlin, tostadas, fried tacos filled with machaca a Sinaloan dried beef chiles stuffed with ranchero cheese, charcoal grilled chicken and beef tenderloin, carne asada along with rice, refried beans, guacamole, salsas, chips, pineapple tamales and sweet empanada. And don't forget some hot corn tortillas hand pressed and cooked right before your eyes. So fill your plate and find a seat; the show is about to begin!
